### Distant Early Warning

It is a humbling thing when some of your body parts start to give out on you. There's the normal wear and tear of attrition as you age, of course, but now and then your body lets you know changes are coming and they're not all welcome.

Still, it was something of a surprise a few months ago when I noticed that my left hand was starting to have a mind of its own. It had, after all, helped me earn a living for almost four decades in concert with my right hand, typing hundreds of articles without much more than an occasional twinge or complaint. I did have a finger operated on some years ago when I woke up every day with my ring finger bent backwards. But when the problem resurfaced despite the operation, I just resigned myself to bending it back straight every morning. Life went on.

But this was different. I started to notice that, after I typed for even a short period of time, my left hand would start trembling. As someone who used to make a living at a keyboard, this was quite unsettling. It seemed to be random, too; some days I could type several hundred words with no tremor; other days I'd type a paragraph and my left hand let me know that was it for the day.

Where this particular saga will lead is anyone's guess. At this stage I see it as something of a Distant Early Warning Signal that I'll either have to type with one hand or, inevitably, abandon life at the keyboard. That would be hard for someone who has been writing pretty much daily since I was in eighth grade. It's in my DNA.

Here's what I have learned: If you cannot even control your left hand when you type, you surely cannot control every aspect of your life. It seems God is asking me, and perhaps all of us as well, to look at life in a new way....His will be done. Ready or not, this will take some getting used to.


