The Biggest 'Ta-Da' Ever

There's a sweet anecdote in the latest issue of The Joyful Noiseletter, the ecumenical publication of the Fellowship of Merry Christians, a group which has been uplifting hearts and minds with humor since the mid-1980s.

I don't have it it front of me, but the gist of the anecdote is that the question arises of what Jesus' first words were after His resurrection. Told that we really don't know, a little girl jumps up and down to tell her pastor, "I know! I know!" The pastor reiterates that Scripture does not record what Jesus first said after His resurrection. But the little girl persists. "I know! I know! " she insists. "It was, 'Ta-Da!"

It's a cute story, bringing a laugh and a smile. But when one thinks about it, Easter is not in any way about "cute." In fact, it is about the single most astonishing, all-encompassing moment in human history. Because if Jesus had not arisen from that tomb 2000 years ago, the salvation of millions upon millions of people since would never have taken place. Untold numbers of martyrs would never have given up their lives in defense of the Lord's resurrection and defeat of death.

Furthermore, without the resurrection the news of the Passion, death and resurrection would never have been recorded and passed down. If so, there would be no Church with its sacraments and liturgy, no Christian schools, hospitals, orphanages, or countless charitable institutions around the globe. It all hinges on the moment He came out of the tomb.

In fact, Jesus himself would have remained, in the minds of the people of his time, a good man, a thoughtful rabbi and perhaps a prophet, but nothing more. His resurrection indelibly changed all of that.

So you could say that the little girl had it right. With all due reverence, it was indeed the biggest "Ta-Da!" of all time.


