The Fragile Flame of Faith

Do you remember the day you made your First Communion? I do, but only because I came across a placard from the day with the date (May 11, 1958) printed across the bottom.

I remember that the scene was huge, since there were over 200 students in second grade (four classrooms) at the Catholic school I attended. It must have taken two hours to complete the Mass in that huge church. I recall wearing blue pants, black shoes, a white shirt and a blue tie. Mom had Vitalised down my unruly cowlick. But that's all I remember.

What brought this to mind was attending granddaughter Kaylee's First Communion in Gesu Church near John Carroll University. She was excited, while we in her pew were proud and delighted. But something else about that service made it even more memorable.

Masses at Gesu are traditionally packed, but we were awestruck by the number of youngsters present, toddlers to teens. Even more unusual these days: The number of young mothers carrying infants in their arms while simultaneously visibly pregnant again. It was as if the parishioners there had collectively decided to defy the widespread perception in America that having babies and raising children is fatal to one's career and happiness.

Gesu is, of course, an outlier, being located where so many families can easily attend one of the many weekend Masses. Numerous other parishes with declining attendance in the Cleveland Diocese have been merged or closed; the blessed sounds of babies crying and toddlers climbing over kneelers have long since been forgotten there. But what a joy it was to be immersed in that experience for one afternoon.

As we watched each First Communicant leave their pew to come forward for the first time to receive the Lord of the Universe, I couldn't help but think of how fragile their joy truly was. Keeping that sweet childhood faith alive through these turbulent times will require dedicated parents, grandparents, extended family, teachers, friends and the grace of the Holy Spirit against all odds into adulthood.

Still, every year, Catholic parents step forward to, first of all, have children, and beyond that, to raise them in this remarkable Faith that has survived for 20 centuries. May Kaylee and her classmates keep that fragile flame of faith alive, well beyond when their own memories of this special day have long been forgotten.


