Truth In Advertising

Got an interesting piece of advertising in the mail the other day. It began: "We'd like to thank you for your interest in purchasing a vehicle service contract through us." Cheerful opening, but one problem. We know, and they know, that we have never contacted them for a service contract and never would. After all, the 2010 car they want us to cover has 195,000 miles on it. If it breaks down anytime soon, it's off to the junkyard pronto.

This missive about our old vehicle was the latest, but certainly not the last, deceptive piece of advertising we have received of late. Another that arrived last week said we requested a loan, which we never applied for. Some of these pieces come in the mail, while a fair amount targets us via voicemail.

We keep getting calls, for example, from some out-of-state company determined to help us eradicate "your unfortunate list of back taxes owed to Federal and State governments." They apparently view us as major tax cheats, but fortunately we have never owed a penny in back taxes to any governments in our lifetime. We also get calls claiming we owe thousands in credit card debt. I'd love to engage these folks by telling them they are dealing with a couple who have two credit cards, one apiece, and owe \$300 until the end of this month.

It seems to me that these flyers and calls are part of an escalating trend in our society to, shall we say, circumvent the truth. There are, of course, outright shysters bilking the elderly on fraudulent home repairs and such, a truly horrible situation for which the perpetrators deserve serious prison time. But most of the callers seem more likely to hope we are asleep at the wheel and gullible enough to spend large amounts on items or services we do not need. It was P.T. Barnum, that huckster extraordinaire, who said "there's a sucker born every minute." All too often, his modern day successors prove the point as too many folks lose their life savings to heartless would-be saviors.

It's sad that, as these fraudulent solicitations pile up, more of us end up not believing almost anybody about almost anything. That leads to a cynicism not healthy for any of us. Maybe it's all part of a broader precipitous decline in manners and morals in western civilization in recent decades. But that's a thought for another day.

Lenten Regulations from

U.S. Catholic Bishops

Ash Wednesday (March 5) and Good Friday (April 18) are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.

In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence (no meat). For members of the Latin Catholic Church (St. Brendan, St. Christine, and Our Lady of Sorrows, for example), the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59.

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.




