A More Honest Assessment

There was a country music song about 1980 that I used to enjoy called "Hard To Be Humble (When You're Perfect In Every Way)." The singer was songwriter extraordinaire Mac Davis, a heart-throb for untold numbers of women. His hit was a tongue-in-cheek slice of life about a singer whose ego was so huge that he could never sustain a relationship because "I treasure my own company."

If I'd ever been a hundredth as good looking as Mac Davis, I'd have probably treasured my own company, too. Alas, when the Lord of the Universe was doling out gifts, He forgot to include drop-dead good looks, a great voice, immense songwriting creativity, and musical talent among mine. Davis and I are both males, both have voice boxes, both have faces, and both know guitar chords. But, unfortunately for me, the similarity ends there. Over the decades, I have managed to accept this unaccountable oversight on the part of the Almighty, and have sought to make an impact in other, much less public, ways.

But the hook to that once immense country and pop hit has me thinking. It resonates with me this Lent in a reverse way: Lord, it's not hard to be humble; it's hard to be proud or self-satisfied if we are honest about our shortcomings in living the life You have called us to live. A more honest assessment might be, "Lord, it's hard to be truthful about acknowledging the many ways in which we have failed to live as You called us to live. Sin has led us astray."

One only has to look at the lack of long lines outside of our confessionals to know that a huge percentage of today's Catholics do not think they sin at all, and certainly not seriously enough to warrant lying awake at night worrying about it. It's always so much easier to point out our neighbor's faults than acknowledge our own. But sin is serious business that demands our attention. Let's be strong enough in faith to reject the trendy view that we either never sin or, if we do, it will all be erased by a merciful God no matter how we have lived in this world.

With two weeks left in Lent, there is still time to look deep into our souls to evaluate how well we have done in progressing toward the goals we set for ourselves on Ash Wednesday. Doing so, it's easy to see there is plenty for all of us to be concerned about, not to mention deeply humble as well.




